Message from Mary Mamer Pacific Shores Region 12 Events Coordinator

Hello, Region 12 members and welcome to the 46th Annual Convention and Competition. It is so wonderful to be back together in person after 3 years of virtual and distant contest events. You will see many changes at the Nugget and with the convention:

- 1. We will have a new videographer this year. Some of you may remember John Dietrich who filled in for Randy Sahae during our contest recording sessions last year. He is delightful to work with and I'm sure you will all be happy with his work. This year, all recordings are available to your group on a flash drive.
- 2. We will have a new sound and lighting company. They plan to have technicians there for the contest to help problem solve and make sure all is going well.
- 3. The cost of printing programs has increased significantly. Therefore, instead of handing out paper programs, it will be available on our website. If you didn't print a program before you came, you can access it on your electronic device. There are QR codes posted around the ballroom and at registration to give you quick access from your phone. If you do choose this option, please do not have your screen light on during a performance. Your Regional Convention Committee is very interested in feedback about how this system worked for you. - 4. Contest charms are back, and they were available by preorder through your chorus. If you want one, hopefully you already had the opportunity to order it. There will be a few extra charms available for purchase at the registration desk.
- 5. Joanna Davis is the Competition Coordinator this year with the assistance of Donna Prochazka and Kim Machek. This will be Donna's last year on the competition committee and Kim is in training to be Joanna's assistant.
- 6. The Saturday night chorus meals and Quartet Stroll have been moved to various meeting rooms all on the same floor as the ballroom. This way the quartets will not have far to walk as they stroll from chorus to chorus, and everyone is on one level.

7. The Afterglow is moved to Sierra 5 instead of the poolside room on the 5th floor. Again, with all our Saturday activities on the same floor it will be easier for everyone to make their way to the Afterglow and enjoy the celebration.

This is my last convention as the Events Coordinator for Region 12. It has certainly been an interesting 6 years full of unusual challenges. After the first couple of years, I had hit my stride and felt comfortable with this job. Then with the pandemic, we had to get creative and figure out different ways to do everything, including contest activities that were already set. Learning how to conduct business by zoom challenged our learning curve, but it has now become a routine way to hold a meeting. Through all of it, we survived, and I believe Region 12 will continue to come back even stronger.

I am pleased to turn over the reins of this job to Mary Dean Heil. She has years of experience with SAI (51 to be exact) along with organizational skills and leadership roles within her chorus. She is currently the Team Leader of Diablo Vista Chorus. I will be working with her to support her as she transitions into this role of Events Coordinator.

I encourage all members to consider taking on a volunteer role either at the regional level or in your chorus. We are an organization that operates on volunteers and your help is always needed somewhere. The CRC position is not filled currently and is one that is important to the function of the RCSC. This position is appointed by the Events Coordinator as they work closely together. Assistant positions are available for every position on the Regional Convention Steering Committee so you can see how the role fits and to learn the job. This often facilitates moving into the role. Many of the positions take a year or two before someone is comfortable taking on the job. Feel free to reach out to any RCSC member if you have questions or would like to volunteer. Planning for the 2024 convention will start in August so now is the time to get on board.

I sincerely thank you for allowing me to serve as your Events Coordinator for the past 6 years. It has been an honor.

ALL-EVENTS TICKETS AND BADGES – Your All-Events Badge is your ticket of admission to the Quartet and Chorus competitions and the Afterglow. You will not be admitted without it (unless you are in performance costume).

HANDICAPPED SEATING – Several areas are set aside to accommodate those in wheelchairs, walkers, etc. Please make sure that these seats are available to those who need them.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES – As a courtesy to our performers and those in the audience, be sure to <u>SILENCE</u> all cell phones, tablets, and alarms while inside the competition room. **NOTE:** If you are following the program on an electronic device, please make sure the device screen is OFF during all performances.

PHOTOGRAPHY RULES – The official photographer for any official Sweet Adelines competition exclusive rights to take photographs for sales purposes. This does not restrict news and amateur photographers from taking pictures for purposes other than sale. However, no photography of any kind is permitted while a competitor is on stage.

However, please be mindful of the competitors and guests; please no crinkling, crackling or shaking the ice in your drink while in the ballroom. 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



Emergency Procedures

Nugget Casino Resort

The Nugget has an Emergency Response Team (ERT) that will respond to all emergencies. This team is trained in First-Aid/CPR and is AED certified. Dial "0" for the operator and they will dispatch Security.

- In an emergency please give the location and type of emergency. If it involves a person, attempt to get the following information:
 - 1. Approximate age including male or female
 - 2. Location or type of injury
 - 3. Medications this person is taking
- Stay on the phone with the operator and convey any additional information while waiting for assistance to arrive. Please do not hang up the phone; the Operator may have additional questions asked by the ERT or emergency services.
- The Nugget has Security on duty 24 hours/day, 7 days/week. Building cameras are recording 24 hours/day, 7 days/week as well. Security patrols the entire hotel including the immediate areas outside of the building. Security can be contacted through the operator "0".
- In the event that an emergency arises, announcements will be made through the hotel's Public Address System. In the event of fire alarm activation, the system has an automatic evacuation announcement that will include a message instructing you on what to do and where to go.
 Depending on the location of the alarm activation, the elevators may or may not be operable.
 Emergency stairs are available at the end of the corridor on both the north and south ends of the building.
- Hotel staff will respond to all emergencies. If you are unsure about what to do or where the
 emergency exits are located, please review the fire evacuation procedures and map on the back
 of the guest room entry door. Be aware that all emergency exits have EXIT signs above the
 door.
- We have safes in all guest rooms and at the Cashier's Cage and encourage you to place all valuables there.
